- 1 x Beanie Hat
- (if visiting during dry season)
- 2 x Pyjamas
- Underwear
- Gym clothes (if your lodge has a gym)
- Insect Repellent
- Anti-Malaria Medication

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Top Safari Packing Tips

Opt for earthy tones and avoid dark blue and black. These colors can attract tsetse flies.

Wear lightweight, breathable clothes that wick away moisture. Avoid camouflage patterns in some African countries, as they are illegal.

Layering is key: Temperatures can vary drastically between morning drives and evenings, bring light layers and a warm jacket.

Evening attire: Many lodges have a relaxed approach, no formal wear needed.

Sustainability: Some countries ban single-use plastic bags; bring reusable alternatives.

Mosquito precautions: Consider clothing with long sleeves or garments treated with insect-repellent

fabric; a mosquito net can also help.

Currency: Check accepted money; some countries prefer US\$.

Luggage: Check size restrictions, especially for flying safaris or safari trucks. Some require soft bags. Remote travel: Consider a first aid kit with sterilised

equipment.
